### 3. Working Group - Erasmus+ Programme:

#### Implementation:

- Assignment of **one representative per theme** that will lead to a proposal in the next call.









### 4. Working Group - Vocational Education & Training subgroup:

### **Objective**

- Creation of a working group that provides an **observatory** to identify **innovative** trends that should be transformed into skills and competences to maintain a pertinent level of professional qualifications in the sector.
- Via the subgroup more VET centres will be attracted.









### 4. Working Group - Vocational Education & Training subgroup:

#### Implementation:

- 1. Extension of the E&T panel of experts that will gather all representative stakeholders from:
  - Universities and R&D centres (forestry, construction, furniture), VET centres of both intermediate and higher level (wood, furniture, construction and upholstery)
  - **Business** associations
  - Trade unions and social agents
  - Representative companies at European level
- Establishment of a Webinar every 6 months to share results of:
  - Ouestionnaires with:
    - Key questions from which **trends** will be highlighted. This observatory will identify innovative trends of the evolution of the forestry, furniture and construction sector.
    - Question for analysis of European projects carried out both under the umbrella of InnovaWood and general European projects, whose findings or results should also provide information of trends and developments in the sector in the coming years or distant future.
- 3. These key results will be transferred to IW Boards for decision-making and share with VET centres.

- Letter of invitation to see if they are interested to join IW (During workshop > support of national IW members to send invitations)



#### Mobility rule – IF-2016:

#### **European Fellowships**



#### STANDARD EUROPEAN FELLOWSHIP

- ER of any nationality must move or have moved from any country to the MS or AC where the host institution is located
- ☐ Mobility rule: not have resided or carried out his / her main activitiy in the country of the host institution for more than 12 months / 3 years prior to the call deadline
- ☐ Duration of the project: 12 24 months (secondments included)

#### **CAREER RESTART PANEL (CAR)**

- ☐ Support to researchers who want to resume research in Europe after a break in research
- ER of any nationality who must move or have moved from any country to the MS / AC where the host institution is located
- □ Break in research: not active in research for at least 12 months prior to the deadline of submission (10/09/15)
- Multidisciplinary Panel
- ☐ Duration of the project: 12-24 months

#### REINTEGRATION PANEL (RI)

- Support to researchers who want to return and reintegrate in a longer term research position in Europe
- Mobility from a Third Country to a MS / AC where the host institution is located
- ER eligible: nationals or long-term residents of a MS / AC (min. 5 consecutive years carrying out research in 1 or more MS / AC)
- Multidisciplinary Panel
- ☐ Duration of the project: 12-24 months

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Specific mobility rule CAR/RI: no more than 36 months out of the 5 years previous to the Call deadlne

- ☐ Duration: 12-24 months, outgoing phase in a TC + 12 months returning phase in Europe.
- ER elegible: nationals and long-term residents in MS / AC
- Mobility from any country to the TC of the outgoing phase
- Mobility rule to be fulfilled in the TC of the outoing phase
- ☐ Minimum participation: 1 beneficiary in MS / AC (host institution) + 1 Partner Organisation in TC
- ☐ Letter of Commitment from Partner Organisation in TC compulsory

- Any career level
- Universities, research centres or companies (SME's)

#### Implementation:

- Joint research and innovation project: at least three partners, at lest three different countries (at least two from EU or associated countries)
- Intersectoral

Budget (2016): ≈ 80 M€

6. Working Group - Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions. Co-funding of regional, national and international programmes (COFUND)

#### **Objective:**

- Founding (additional) of research mobility programme in order to expand or enhance international and intersectoral dimension
- Government ministry, regional authority, funding agency, university, research organisation, research academy or enterprise

#### Implementation:

- For organisations that fund or manage doctoral programmes or fellowship programmes for researchers
- Co-funding new or existing regional, national, and international programmes to open up to, and provide for, international, intersectoral and interdisciplinary research training, as well as transnational and cross-sectoral mobility of researchers at all stages of their career
- Doctoral programme
- Fellowship programmes: individual research training for experienced researchers



### 7. Working Group: An International Master course coordinated by **InnovaWood**

#### **Context**

 Demand for Master level course present but insufficient to establish a course

#### **Solution**

- Several institutes combine their resources and students to create a viable course
- Course in English
- Delivered physically and on-line
- InnovaWood members have the skills and resources necessary to create and run such a course









### Why organise an International Master?

- **Alone** 
  - Teaching in English
    - A module or 2 but a whole course?
- In a consortium
  - Administrative obstacles
    - Diploma
    - Pre-requisites
    - Duration
  - Fees
    - Who to receive and how much?
  - Logistic difficulties
    - Staff/student travel
    - **Accommodation**











### Why NOT organise an International Master?

### Potential solutions

- At least 3 institutes providing 2 modules and a workshop each
  - Modules taught at institute and streamed onto web
  - Week long workshops designed and delivered by each institute that are attended by all students
  - If many institutes then some modules optional, i.e. students can tailor to their needs
- Each participating institute register their students and award their diploma
- Institute charges their normal fees
