**PD 6.3.2: EFORWOOD Training Plan based on gap analysis.**

The Training Plan represented by the matrix below is based on two Training Needs surveys carried out among all EFORWOOD Module and WP leaders.

In March 2006 a first TN questionnaire was sent out to all Eforwood Module leaders with the request to coordinate the distribution to their WP leaders. Seven responses were received.

In May 2006 a second TN questionnaire was sent out to all Eforwood Module and WP leaders. Twelve responses were received.

Interviewees were asked, by means of open questions, to identify the training themes and desired results most relevant to them. Interviewees were also asked to suggest target groups for that training and format of the training.

It was decided to leave the questions open, in order to extract the respondents' personal priorities. In other words, to find out which connotations respondents have when confronted with the concept of training.

Additional input was gathered during the workshops taking place at the EFORWOOD week in Carcavelos, Portugal in November 2006.

The training needs matrix includes a listing of training themes, desired results, target groups for training and format of training. The listing is not ranked, as the responses identified a wide range of possible training themes, making it non-justifiable to apply a ranking. Hence, all training themes identified by the respondents are listed, although some grouping has been applied, for the sake of clarity.

The outcomes of the Training Needs survey (the matrix, i.e. the Training Plan) have been incorporated in the EFORWOOD Communications Strategy (March 2007), together with the results of the other surveys (i.e. Dissemination and Exploitation Plan ; Knowledge Transfer Plan).
